

# The President's Podium

#### **STATUS SPRING 2011**

The annual Rally Day went well. Mike Fischer sang some of his new work and was a great hit. Video of the Rally may appear in his next video (see www.thefischers.net). Over thirty legislators, the Lt. Governor and a representative of the Governor spoke to our crowd in the Capital Building in Jefferson City. This was an enormous change from the early days when few legislators wanted to be seen with us. The difference is that for twenty

years crowds have appeared for Rally Day. The legislators counted the crowd found that people who took a day from work to support their rights would also take time to support politicians who supported those rights. We have managed to elect a friendly legislature with friends in both parties. But this is not enough.

We have prevented all but one or two minor bad laws, repealed bad laws and passed good ones. But this is not enough.

The United States Supreme Court has twice affirmed our right to own guns. But this is not enough.

The Supreme Court decided our way by just one vote. The dissenting justices are making the rounds of speaking engagements to create a revisionist history of guns in America. They claim, without a speck of proof, that the founders did not intend an individual right to own guns. Overturning the two decisions may be unlikely. However, a year after the MacDonald case we still do not have a standard for enforcing our rights. Laws are evaluated for Constitutional violations largely by the "strict scrutiny" or "reasonable basis" tests. Under strict scrutiny the government must have overwhelming need to restrict an activity. Under reasonable basis they need only present some coherent reason for the law. The courts have split the difference in some cases using an "intermediate scrutiny" test. There is some reason to believe the Court may adopt intermediate scrutiny in Second Amendment cases. Without an articulated standard, lower courts are free to craft their own tests. The Brady campaign brags that petitioners have lost 350 challenges under the Second Amendment. Most of these were by convicts who had nothing to loose and nothing else to do. Many were filed with more enthusiasm than legal, factual or financial support. Still, this creates a bad image, one in which the Second Amendment does not mean very much.

Anti-gun groups and politicians have been more aggressive. There are whispers that the Obama administration will attack guns and shooting rights in its second term. We need people to stand up and be counted. Write letters to newspapers and politicians, even if they are disregarded, they will be counted. Show up at rallies and be counted. Find out what politicians are on our side and show you can be counted on. There have been some disputes in the shooting community this Spring. The first is introduction of Elk into the Ozarks. There have been fears of traffic collisions with mountains of meat, livestock disease and damage to crops. Others look forward to a day trip to hunt elk. I am willing to let the experts at the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) have their experiment. If it does not work, it can be eliminated with an extended hunting season, perhaps with handguns.

The second dispute concerns a bill establishing a handgun season for deer. The MDC insists that this is their constitutional province. There are threats of lawsuits between the executive and legislative branches. At the time I write this, the bill still awaits a final vote. Regardless of the outcome, we shall have to have better communication with the MDC. Anyone with suggestions on this point can use my e-mail address at the top of this column, or send letters to the MSSA post office box.



# **MO Shooting News**

In 2011, Missouri 4-H will pilot a new project that combines cowboy shooting (4-H style) with the study/appreciation of the American West. The program was developed & piloted in Montana and has been adopted as part of their 4-H program. Missouri will see if; and how it fits our 4-H program. Five to 8 county programs will be selected to conduct a 2 year pilot program locally. Two new donors to the state 4-H Shooting Sports program have made this opportunity possible: Sierra Bullets and Starline Brass, both of Sedalia.

The purpose of this project is to provide an avenue for 4-H members and adult leaders to experience the lifestyles and cultures of the Old West from the period of around 1860-



1900 through a living history approach to learning.

The Cowboy Action Shooting portion of this project is arguably the fastest paced, most exciting, and spectator friendly project in 4-H shooting sports. Shooters dressed in Old West garb compete against the clock by firing at steel or cardboard targets at various distances with period firearms such as single action revolvers, lever action rifles, and double barreled shotguns. This NOT mounted shooting – no horses are involved with the shooting portion of this project.

#### **Objectives:**

- 1. Provide an enjoyable and action oriented shooting sports activity that will attract new and retain current 4-H members throughout their teen years.
- 2. Preserve and gain an appreciation for the heritage of the Old West within the time period of 1860-1900.
- 3. Teach in a living history style through the use of historically accurate firearms, clothing, and accessories while participating in the 4-H Western Heritage Project.
- 4. Instill in 4-H members an investigative interest in Missouri & western history that will lead to personal research and increased knowledge of the Old West.
- 5. Recognize the accomplishments and importance of both men and women from a diversity of cultures and races that contributed to history of the American West.

At first, the emphasis will be on the shooting portion of the project. As the program matures, we expect to see more Living History. There are still many details to work out; as well as policies & procedures to develop. This workshop will provide the initial information and training needed to begin a Western Heritage/Cowboy Shooting project this upcoming 4-H year.

## MSSA Junior High Power Camp June 24 - 26, 2011

The format is to introduce shooters to precision bulls eye shooting with full bore rifles, particularly Service Rifles (AR-15 style rifles). The camp is open to both male and female participants; however, we ask that any female participants be accompanied by a chaperone. We will focus on the various positions of shooting (standing, sitting and prone) at ranges out to 600 yards.

The camp will start at 12 Noon on the 24th and will end following a match on June 26th at approx. 2pm. The participants will have access to a bed, showers and toilets. They will need to bring their own bedding or sleeping bag. Toiletries and bath towels will also be needed. Three meals a day will be provided and water for drinking. Any other snack or sodas will need to be the responsibility of the shooter. There will be refrigerators available for their drinks.

The students are encouraged to bring their own rifle and ammo. The rifle needs to be an AR -15 style rifle with iron sights. We will not be using optics as part of the training. They will need approx. 250 rounds of .223 cal. ammo. The camp will be using some .22 LR conversions kits for training and ammo will be provided. If you have a .22 conversion kit and magazines, please bring it. If you do not have a rifle for use, one will be provided. If you do use one of the MSSA rifles, you will not be allowed to use your own ammo unless it is factory ammo.

I got a copy of Gun Running on the Northwest Frontier. The frontier in question was the North West frontier of British India, which is now Pakistan. The book was written in 1911, which, for those of you not paying attention, was a century ago; it does not appear that much has changed. I was interested in gun-running. However, the book is more of a travelogue written in the paternalistic style of the British sahib. It does mention gun running across the frontier and by sea through Iran but only in passing. One sentence refers to tribal gun factories, but the author never saw them. There were no laws against owning guns in India until the British decided they could civilize the place. The North West tribes saw no reason to obey the gun laws; they obeyed no other British law and saw no reason to start with this one. I am not certain how the author obtained his information about the local people. His interpreter may have told him what he wanted to hear, or he may have gotten the information the old-fashioned way and made it up. He mentions the importance of a tribe having the grave of a Moslem saint. Such shrines gave the tribe status, and income from pilgrims. One tribe reportedly did not have grave of a saint and so invited a holy man to visit and killed him. If true, this shows a certain practica lity but clearly they are working from a different set of principles.

I listened to an audiobook, Supersense; Why We Believe in the Unbelievable. The author is an atheist, so his view of the unbelievable is larger than most person's. He discusses the awe people have for objects. He conducted seminars in which he showed the audience a fountain pen which he said belonged to Albert Einstein (he lied). Everyone wanted to touch the pen. He then showed a cardigan sweater and asked who wanted to try it on. Einstein was famously

shown wearing a cardigan and most wanted to try it on. He then said that it belonged to a notorious serial killer; the audience changed its mind. People associate the object with the owner and tend to believe that it transmits the characteristics of the owner. This is magical thinking and we frequently encounter this sort of thing in the firearms world. Some primitive minds believe that not only the gun used by the criminal carries his attributes, but that all guns carry his cooties. The author speculates why collectors value antique objects but not replicas. We know why. Our antiques were carried by people in great and mundane acts which have made our history. They are imbued with the DNA of individuals who do not appear in the history books but collectively made our history.

As I write this the Missouri legislature has finished its 2011 session. They passed the omnibus firearms bill. This bill reduces the age at which one may get a License To Carry to 21. It also allows us to buy long guns in all other states and persons from other states to buy long guns here (if allowed by their home state). There were some changes in the bill at the last minute and it will be a little time before I understand exactly what passed. I will post my evaluation at www.KLJamisonLaw.com/author.

The bill to establish a handgun hunting season was not pushed in favor of working with the Missouri Department of Conservation. This should have been done earlier, but we have failed to have an ongoing relationship with the MDC. We can fix this.

We should have a handgun season for deer. We have an atlatl season. An atlatl is a spear thrower, a short stick used to give extra leverage and therefore power to a thrown spear. No one has taken a deer with an atlatl in Missouri, at least not for the last 20,000 years or more, but the sport is called hunting, not killing.

People have likened making laws to making sausage. It is more like making jigsaw puzzles with poor quality control. One legislator will not allow a bill to go forward unless it includes a handful of pieces from his puzzle. Others want certain pieces of the puzzle removed, altered or replaced with other pieces which may or may not fit with the other pieces. In the end there is no telling what the picture will look like until we have a chance to examine it in detail. Often the picture looks a great deal like making sausage, and not the sort you would want for breakfast.

I was watching a DVD of the old Dragnet series from 1969. The series clearly gave the Los Angles Police Department's official line in these episodes. In one, a man came in to pick up his permit to buy a handgun. It is quickly determined that the man is a raving loon and the permit is decisively shut back in the file. This is the image portrayed of people who want to buy handguns. In another episode Sgt. Friday is on a panel answering questions from the public. One citizen objects to the delays in getting handgun permits and is told that policemen carry only because it is required and do not like carrying guns, that he is better off without one and if he has time to get his gun he has time to call the police. This last may be correct, but then one must wait for the police to arrive. In every large city there are "blackout" periods in which no police officer is available, no matter the crisis. Such blackouts did not occur in the old series, it not being department policy.

It has been a year since MacDonald vs Chicago ruled that the states must respect the Second Amendment. After a year we still do not have a standard for judging restrictions on arms. Courts have ruled that even the First Amendment allows for restrictions on time, place and manner of speech. The MacDonald case did not specify the standards for judging restrictions on the Second Amendment. The Supreme Court sent the case back to the 7th Circuit appellate court for determination of a standard; there it sits. In the last year we have seen the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals rule once again in the Nordyke case. The plaintiffs in Nordyke sued Alemeda County, California after the county passed an ordinance forbidding gun shows at the county fairgrounds. The case has been litigated up and down the judicial system for the last eight or nine years. The last ruling was that the county can prohibit gun shows on county property. The Brady Bunch has declared this a great victory. However, the court went on to rule that laws cannot touch on the core right of self-defense. This calls into question California's laws against carrying guns for self-defense. This is encouraging. The NRA has filed a lawsuit in Illinois challenging its denial of the right to carry guns for self-defense. Illinois failed to pass a concealed carry law this year and furt her steps are required.

We shall overcome.

# **Legislative Rundown**

#### Summary of the Truly Agreed Version of the Bill

SS#2 SCS HCS HB 294, 123, 125, 113, 271 & 215 -- FIREARMS

This bill changes the laws regarding firearms, ammunition, and concealed carry endorsements. In its main provisions, the bill:

(1) Prohibits the sales tax on any firearms or ammunition from being levied at a higher rate than for any sales tax or other excise tax charged on any sporting goods or equipment or any hunting equipment (Section 144.064);

(2) Specifies that a nondriver's license containing a concealed carry endorsement will expire three years from the date the certificate of qualification was issued. The fee for nondriver's licenses issued for a period exceeding three years will be \$6 or \$3 for licenses issued for a period of three years or less (Sections 302.181 and 571.101);

(3) Creates the crime of fraudulent purchase of a firearm, a class D felony, if a person knowingly solicits, persuades, encourages, or entices a licensed dealer or private seller of firearms or ammunition to transfer a firearm or ammunition under circumstances which the person knows would violate federal or state laws; provides to a licensed dealer or private seller of firearms or ammunition what the person knows to be materially false information with the intent to deceive the dealer or seller about the legality of a transfer of a firearm or ammunition; or willfully procures another to violate these provisions. These provisions do not apply to criminal investigations conducted by the United States Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (Section 571.063);

(4) Repeals non-penalty merchandising practices provisions, in Sections 407.500 and 407.505, which restrict the sale of rifles and shotguns by requiring purchasers or sellers to live in Missouri or a contiguous state and to conform to federal and state gun regulations. Currently, handguns are not subject to this merchandising practice regulation because all permit requirements for purchasing a handgun have been repealed. The bill applies this practice to all types of firearms by allowing a Missouri resident or the resident of any state to purchase any firearm if he or she conforms to federal laws and the laws of the state in which he or she resides (Sections 571.085 and 571.087); and 571.117);

(6) Specifies that current provisions do not preclude a member of the General Assembly, a full-time or legislative employee of the General Assembly, or statewide elected officials and their employees who hold a valid concealed carry endorsement from carrying a concealed firearm in the State Capitol Building (Section 571.107);

(7) Specifies that a certificate of firearms safety training course completion may be issued to any applicant by any qualified firearms safety instructor if the applicant completes at least eight hours of instruction that includes a live firing exercise of sufficient duration for the applicant to fire both a revolver and a semiautomatic pistol and specifies that any firearms safety instructor who knowingly provides any sheriff with any false information concerning an applicant's performance on any portion of the required training and qualification will be guilty of a class C misdemeanor (Section 571.111); and

(8) Specifies that a municipality may regulate, by order or ordinance, the shooting of pneumatic guns within its boundaries when, in the opinion of the governing body, it is so heavily populated that the conduct is dangerous to its inhabitants. The municipality may require any minor younger than 12 years of age when using pneumatic gun on public property to be supervised. Any minor 12 years of age or older may, with parental or guardian consent, use a pneumatic gun at any place designated for its use or on private property with the owner's consent. However, the minor must obey all laws, regulations, and restrictions regardless of whether a parent or guardian has permitted the use. No ordinance can prohibit the use of pneumatic guns at facilities approved for shooting ranges (Section 1).

The provisions regarding the issuance of nondriver's licenses containing conceal carry endorsements will become effective when the Director of the Department of Revenue begins to issue nondriver's licenses with the conceal carry endorsement that expire three years from the date the certificate of qualification was issued, or January 1, 2013, whichever occurs first.

(5) Lowers the age at which a person can obtain a concealed carry endorsement from 23 to 21 years of age (Sections 571.101
