# Gov. Signs Gun Rights Bill

On July 8th, Missouri Governor Jay Nixon signed into law an expansion of firearms rights for Missouri gun

owners. Among the provisions in this critical bill include lowering Missouri's Right-To-Carry age from the nation's highest at 23 years of age, to 21.

NRA backed bill, House Bill 294, supported in the Senate by state Senator Brian Munzlinger (R-18), is a comprehensive firearm bill that addresses a number of Right-To-Carry issues important to Missouri's law abiding gun owners. Both chambers of Missouri General Assembly passed HB 294 by overwhelming majorities.

HB 294 will improve Missouri gun laws by:

- Prohibiting sales taxes on firearms or ammunition from being higher than those for sporting goods, sporting equipment, bunti
  - for sporting goods, sporting equipment, hunting equipment, and accessories;
- Allowing residents to purchase long guns from non-contiguous states and vice versa by removing non-penalty merchandising practices provisions;
- Lowering the concealed carry age to 21;
- Allowing a person to possess, manufacture, transport, repair or sell a machine gun, short barreled rifle or shotgun, or firearm suppressor if he or she complies with federal law.
- Creating the crime of fraudulent firearms purchases if a person knowingly solicits, persuades, encourages, or entices a licensed dealer or private seller of firearms or ammunition to transfer a firearm or ammunition under circumstances which the person knows would violate federal or state laws; and
- Enabling members of the General Assembly and their staff who possess valid concealed carry endorsements to carry a firearm for self-defense in the Capitol.

The other major changes (**NOT MENTIONED BY THE NRA IN ANY OF THEIR PRESS RELEASES**) are in the CCW class. Beginning August 28th, 2011 you will have to fire 50 rounds to practice with a semi-auto, and 50 rounds to practice with a revolver. (Currently it is 50 rounds total). Then for the qualifying test, you will have to fire 20 rounds with a semi-auto, and 20 rounds with a revolver. (Currently it is 20 rounds total). That will bring the total ammunition needed for the class up to 140 rounds minimum, instead of the current 70 minimum! The new requirement will be 140 rounds minimum. 70 revolver + 70 semi-auto.

It is this editor's opinion that the new round change is a step in the wrong direction for concealed carry as it makes obtaining a CCW permit more expensive as additional ammo must be purchase by the shooter and more range time paid for. The additional round requirements also make it harder for our senior citizens to easily obtain a permit to carry as 70 trigger pulls on a revolver can be difficult for some elderly. It's again my opinion that state Rep. Jeanie Riddle (R-20) is to blame for this. Its been rumored she inserted this bit of legislation at the last moment of the session by the request of the owners of Target Masters of Columbia. I would urge all gun owners to stay away from Target Masters in Columbia.

# **Liberty Notes**

# Summer 2011

It is a good day for Liberty.

The comic strip "Dilbert" has the hero telling a co-worker that he has prepared for financial meltdown by stockpiling food, water, batteries and gold coins. The co-worker says that her preparations consist of knowing his home address and noting that his preparations are short on defensive firepower. She asks him to add protein bars to the stockpile. The "K.C. Fringe Festival," a display of various artistic talents, includes a play "Inspiration." This play concerns a future in which all guns have been successfully banned, and people are whacking away at each other with swords. There appears to be a plot concerning the location of a bunker containing lost weapons technology. When the entertainment community begins to acknowledge our position, it is a good sign indeed.

The Humane Society of the United States, the group behind the "puppy mill" initiative petition, is angry that the Missouri legislature modified their bill. They have a new initiative to amend Missouri's Constitution to prohibit modification or repeal of any legislation passed by initiative petition without the support of <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of each house of the legislature. After an unsuccessful initiative petition in 1999, we passed License To Carry (LTC) through the legislature in 2003. It does not appear that the proposed amendment affects our LTC system because the initiative petition to establish LTC in 1999 was not successful. Also, we finally passed LTC before this amendment was proposed (if it passes or not

is another matter). However, that does not mean that the usual suspects could not find a St. Louis judge to issue a restraining order.

I am reliably informed that the first American professional fire fighter to die in the line of duty was killed in St. Louis before the Civil War. And he has been voting ever since.

I received a call from a local jail. The man had an extended family in the area, but he was unable to call them. All family phone numbers were in his phone, and the jail had taken his phone and refused to allow him access. He had never dialed a number, he always scrolled through an electronic list and pushed a button. Consequently, he did not remember anyone's number. Directory assistance was no help; everyone he knew used only cell phones. Even if he could remember a number, many cell phones will not accept collect calls from jails. A battered Yellow Pages in the jail was open to the attorney section, so he called "rent a friend." This teaches us to remember at least one number. Some people have retained me to keep a file on them so that I have a place to start if the worst thing happens.

A client was in his car and returning his handgun to his holster. He followed his training and kept the gun pointed in a safe direction, in this case in the air. Someone saw him and reported him for brandishing a firearm. I take the precaution of keeping my handgun below the dashboard. If a clip-on holster is used the gun is less recognizable and less threatening.

The Southern District Court of Appeals has ruled against petitioners who claimed that the Missouri Department of Conservation hunting and fishing rules are unconstitutionally vague and overbroad. However, the basis of the ruling is that the petitioners did not have standing to complain about the rules because they have not been accused of violating any of them. The case indicates that there is some uncertainty in implementing the rules, so there is an opportunity

for litigation in the future. See Turner v Mo Dept of Conservation handed down 15 July, 2011.

I was reading the appeal of a murder case. This is not unusual by itself. The case turned on the intent of the defendant to kill the victim. The Court ruled that he did intend to kill the victim and in support pointed out that he did not call for medical attention after the assault. Several other cases are cited for this proposition. It appears that the law believes that calling for medical assistance after a shooting reflects the shooter's intention before the shooting. It doesn't have to make sense, its just the law. This stresses the importance of calling for medical attention for the psychopath one was forced to shoot. Even if the thug is dead, requesting medical attention helps negate intention to kill.

The Kansas Supreme Court has ruled that one cannot claim self-defense for issuing threats. Actual physical force is required for a self-defense claim. The classic "Stop or I'll shoot!" is not legal unless one actually shoots.

Mobs are rampaging through cities in England. Today I hear that local "vigilantes" are preparing to defend their neighborhoods. The last pitched battle on English soil was about two-hundred and fifty years ago when neighbors defended their town against a gang of smugglers and cutthroats; they won. I wish the current crop of Home Guard the same. A militarized mob invaded Wales in 1798. The invaders believed they could rape and loot their way to London. Welsh ladies did not see the humor in this and there are reports of Welsh women dealing with the invaders at the point of pitchforks. May their descendents someday have firearms.

I was doing some research on probable cause for police to search containers. One court found that certain containers, by their nature, gave probable cause to search. The court cited cases for guns and burglary tools. I have seen gun cases that did not look like guns. I had a classically influenced client who kept a folding stock Mini-14 in violin case. This case did not give notice of the contents, but the gentleman looked like one of the warning posters about meth addiction. That case did not hinge on search and seizure. The gentleman asked a number of total strangers if they wanted to engage in the meth business with him. He then worried that one might call the police and took shelter in his truck. The police found him there, fast asleep cradling the Mini-14, magazine inserted upside down and backwards; this is your brain on drugs.

Then there is the question of cases for burglary tools. A burglary tool is anything that is used to commit burglaries. This is obviously a broad category. Any toolbox contains implements which could be used for burglaries. The cases are also infinite. This is a ruling without connection to reality. I realize that the Courts of Appeal deal with principles, not fact, but it would be great fun if they were somehow connected to reality. The ruling is a little like the City of Cape Girardeau case which ruled that people can carry guns for self-defense, so long as they are unloaded. This strongly suggests that the Eastern District Court of Appeals does not know how guns work. This is an old case and doubtless due to be overturned in the aftermath of Heller and MacDonald. However it will require what should be an unnecessary court case.

Soon we shall endorse candidates for office. This is always a difficult choice in primaries. Currently there are enough Republican presidential hopefuls to field a basketball team with a few on the bench. They all declare for our side, words are easy. Governor Romney has a bad record for our side, but a Massachusetts gun rights group says that he was the best the state could hope for and his actions were forced or constrained by politics; perhaps not a ringing endorsement. Others are demonstrably on our side but have a narrow base of support and financing. As a practical matter a candidate requires a broad base of support and substantial financing. In the past gun-owner support has been critical to victory in national elections. However, I am not sure that we can carry a candidate with a narrow base of support to victory. I am not so conceited that our weight would bring a candidate to the tipping point. We have endorsed third-party candidates when the two parties were unsatisfactory. I have not always agreed with those endorsements, but I have always supported the decision once it is made. I support the strongest Second Amendment candidate with a real chance of winning. This is not always the perfect Second Amendment candidate, but one who will advance our cause. Part of being a perfect candidate invo lves a real chance of winning. This is not in itself perfect, but we do not live in a perfect world. In a perfect world I would not be writing this column because we would not need a WMSA.

We shall overcome.
