Who Are We?

I have been struggling with tax exempt status for the MSSA Foundation. If successful, donors will be able to get a tax deduction. Since this is money the government will not get, they make it difficult. The heart of the struggle is the redundant question of why we think we are a charity; exactly what good do we do?

We are the NRA state affiliate. This would answer the question in many quarters, but the government, this government, wants more. Our members have participated in youth safety programs involving air rifles, rifles and shotguns. Teaching gun safety saves lives. This should qualify us, if we taught safe sex the government would give us money. We may not be an approved life-saving activity, but we do it anyway.

We have promoted marksmanship sponsoring state matches. Judging by the trophies I passed out at the annual dinner, we have done so very well. Young persons have gone to college on rifle team scholarships due to our tutelage. We have sponsored a few shooters who were aimed at international competition. We have done this for a very long time. I found an article in a 1933 American Rifleman which recounts a large marksmanship competition held by MSSA in Jefferson City. Women had their own teams in those days, perhaps to avoid showing up the men.

Then there were the young people who showed up at boot camp already knowing how to shoot, handle a gun safely and clean the gun afterwards. The experience made them a little better prepared for the worst days of the last dozen years. Some came back with their minds stuffed with demons from the war, and we supported groups that replaced bad memories of shooting with good ones.

Some of our people taught hunting, the ethical way to be a carnivore. Students are taught fairness; fairness to other hunters, and respect for the animals. Participants tell me that there is a reason that the sport is called hunting, not killing.

We do not endorse individual candidates or provide money but promote legal and political education. We sponsor the annual Rally Day in Jefferson City. The 2013 Rally drew 450 participants in the middle of the week. Some of our political representatives told us that they supported us. Our presence told them what they needed to know. An hour after the Rally, they voted to end violations of gun owners' privacy rights. Walking the halls of the legislature does not match the experience of a day afield, but it saves our rights for our children and grandchildren.

We have survived for over eighty years because in every generation MSSA members have passed on our heritage. We shall continue to do so. We have a new face on the MSSA Board. Mary Butler has joined the board and will back up John Leinberger in our junior program. Another generation will learn our sport.

We are four generations of sportsmen, working on five. We pass on our skills and knowledge without pay, compensation and just a little recognition. We need the experiences of the competitions and classes so that we can pass on our heritage. Send your experiences to the newsletter, we deserve the recognition.

Change in Membership Due Dates



MSSA ANNUAL GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING & BANQUET

The annual general membership meeting and banquet of the MSSA was held Saturday, April 27, 2013 in Jefferson City, MO at the DAV building. Shooting championship and recognition awards were presented after dinner. (See list of awards and winners on previous page.)

Approximately 25 members attended the meeting and about 40 others joined them later for dinner and the awards.

After the regular business was finished, seven board of directors seats were up for election, six 3-year terms plus one 2-year term. Six incumbents were reelected: Terry Struse, Larry Crawford, Lee Koester, John Leinberger, Mike Kight, and Grace Leinberger. A previous board opening resulted in also having a 2-year position available. Due to the ballot count, incumbent Larry Crawford filled the 2-year position, and newcomer Mary Butler was elected to a 3-year position. (Executive officers later elected by the board are: President Kevin Jamison, Vice President Grace Leinberger, Secretary Mike Kight, Treasurer Lee Koester, and Executive Officer Phil Anderson.)

The board discussed the very successful Gun Rally held at the State Capitol on April 18, 2013. The event was organized by MSSA board member, Marc Perez. Congratulations Marc, on a job well done! This rally was one of the best. Congratulations and thanks also to those who assisted Marc!

Board member Don Merritt spoke briefly about the Missouri M1's for Vets. This organization presents M1's to Missouri wounded warriors. A formal presentation ceremony is held, usually in Owensville, MO. Following the emotional ceremony, the wounded warrior competes in an M1 match using his rifle. (Additional information on this worthy program appears elsewhere in the newsletter.) The board voted to support the Missouri

Harold Miederhoff, who has made the awards plaques for more than 30 years, has given notice that he is finally retiring. He will no longer be able to make the Missouri walnut, state-shaped plaques. Heartfelt thanks are due to Harold for selflessly creating these plaques for so many shooters and award recipients. Happy retirement, Harold!

This year's after-dinner guest speaker was Missouri District 109 House Representative Paul Curtman.

Representative Curtman was elected to the House in 2010. Prior to that, he received his B. A. in Political Science from the University of MO. He served as a Sergeant in the US Marine Corps from 1999 to 2003 and served as a reservist from 2003 to 2009. He is also a Series 7 Investment Representative. He challenged the members to spend more time learning the true meaning of the US Constitution; the meaning that our forefathers intended when they wrote it.

MIS FOR VETS

The Missouri M1s for Vets is having a special raffle to raise funds to purchase fifteen M1 Garands. (See page 8 for raffle details.)

Normally, no more than one or two rifles are given at one presentation to Missouri wounded warriors; however, because of certain circumstances, there is a need for 15 Garands.

On April 16, 2012, the Taliban in Afghanistan attacked and breached a US compound. In the process of this attack, 15 members out of approximately 70 members of the Missouri National Guard Agribusiness Development Team were wounded. These guard members were chosen from the entire state because of their expertise in the Agribusiness field. They were tasked with teaching the Afghanistani's how to raise crops other than poppies.

Each M1 Garand is approximately \$700. Don Merritt, the state director of Missouri M1s for Vets, tentatively plans to present all 15 of the rifles in Owensville, Missouri on November 12, 2013. This ceremony will be open to the public and should prove to be a very emotional presentation.

There are 33 gun clubs in the U.S. that participates in the M1s for Vets program. To date, approximately 315 rifles have been presented nationally, 70 of which have been presented to Missouri vets

STATE M1 GARAND RIFLE CHAMPIONSHIP

Sponsored by the Owensville Gun Club as the State M1 Garand Rifle Championship. The championship match is sanctioned by the Civilian Marksmanship Program and is conducted at the Owensville Gun Club range at Owensville, Missouri. The championship tournament will be conducted as a CMP M1 Garand match on July 21, 2013.

RANGE LOCATION: Three (3) miles west of Owensville on the north side of Highway 28. There is a cemetery on the left side (south) of Hwy 28 just before the entrance to the range on the right side (north) of Hwy 28.

ELIGIBILITY: Membership in the Missouri Sport Shooting Association is required for Missouri residents participating in the state championship match. Memberships will be available at registration. All participants must complete a CMP Eligibility Affidavit and Liability Agreement (if not previously submitted).

REGISTRATION: Individual registration and entry fees must be received by 8:30 AM, 15 July, 2013. Mail entry fee to: **EQUIPMENT AND AMMUNITION**

You are not registered until your money is received. Competitors may register before the matches up to the range capacity.

RANGE CAPACITY AND LIMITATIONS:

The Owensville Range has 15 covered firing points with a concrete floor. Competitors firing in the Championship Match will be squatted on a first-come first-served basis with a maximum participation of 45 competitors. Food will be available for purchase at the club house.

ENTRY FEES: Make all checks payable to Owensville Gun Club.

M1 Garand State Championship Match \$35.00. This includes 55 rounds of issued 30.06 ammunition, MSSA trophy fee and Club Entry fee.

be refunded if notification is received by for individual matches. 12 July 2013. No-shows will not be refunded. Competitors ejected for deliberate safety, rules violations or disorderly **SCORING**: conduct will not receive a refund.

PIT SERVICE: Owensville Gun Club does not have pits. Competitors will hang their own targets on the frames provided by the Gun Club.

RULES: Tournament will be governed by the current edition CMP Competition Rules. See Rule 6.3 for specific regulations on authorized rifles. See Rule 9.0 for regulations regarding the conduct of firing. There will be no alibis for rifle or ammunition malfunctions. Rifles will be inspected (CMP 6.7.2) and triggers weighed (CMP 6.7.3) for the top scorers at the completion of the match.

RIFLES: M1 Garand Match - "as issued" Caliber .30 U.S. M1 Garand rifles that comply with CMP Rule 6.3.2. All competitors will fire Club issued ammunition.

PERSONAL PROTECTION: It is highly recommended that all competitors wear eye and ear protection.

AMMUNITION: All ammunition for the State Championship M1 Garand Match will be issued, as part of the registration fee, and must be fired for the Championship Match on 15 July. Club ammunition (30.06) will be available for purchase at the match.

CHAMBER FLAGS: Use of empty chamber indicators (ECIs) will be required in all rifles at all times except for rifles being used by competitors on the firing line during the preparation period and actual firing. ECIs (CMP 5.5.1 and 5.5.3) must be inserted in all firearms, whether cased or uncased, at all times the firearm is in the range area (anywhere on the range side of the white gates).

REFUNDS: Two-thirds of the entry fee will **COACHING:** Coaching is not permitted Coaching is permitted during the sighting period.

> Scoring will be done by Owensville Gun Club Staff.

AWARDS: MSSA will award recognition for the top overall shooter, high senior, high junior and high woman at their annual meeting. The Owensville Gun Club will present trophies at the end of the match.

M1 Garand - Course B @ 200 yards

Stage 1 - 5 sighting shots. 5 minutes.

Stage 2 - 20 shots prone slow fire. 20 minutes.

Stage 3 - 10 shots prone (from standing) rapid fire in 80 seconds.

Stage 4 - 10 shots sitting or kneeling (from standing) rapid fire in 70 seconds.

Stage 5 - 10 shots standing slow fire. 10 minutes.

Liberty Notes

April 2013

It is a good day for Liberty.

The Republic of Palau was looking for an Assistant Attorney General. It is an island nation in the South Pacific, tropical climate, and an American legal system. If the advertisement had mentioned their gun laws, I might have run away from home.

In State of Mo v Gregory Allan Rodgers, an opinion issued 2/5/13, the appellate court twice refers to a "Browning .9mm Lugar," which must be a collector's item. The court got this designation from a brief written by a lawyer who must have seen it in a police report or trial testimony. It meant nothing to the decision, but it demonstrates that people who know nothing about guns are deciding which part of a gun is evil.

In *Mission Impossible III*, Tom Cruise has 4 minutes to live and must instruct his wife on how to fight off bad guys while he saves himself and thus the world. He starts off with, "This is a Berretta Model 92, it is an excellent close-range weapon." All true, but with 4 minutes to live, I would have cut to the "point-kill-change magazines" part. In *Hannie Caulder*, Robert Culp is a gunfighter who teaches Raquel Welch how to shoot various rapists she had met. They had also killed her husband; she took offense. He has a great deal more time for instruction and stresses double taps.

We are constantly told that standard magazines must be cut to ten rounds or less because the time consumed in changing magazines will save lives. One "authority" claimed that it takes two seconds. When I was in ROTC, I asked our small arms instructor how long it

took to change magazines, and in his heavy Polish accent, he explained that it was an insignificant amount of time; something even a First Sergeant would not notice. In my own service, I was not the most dexterous Infantry Lieutenant but found that the only delay was occasioned by trying not to drop the magazine, because if I lost it I would have to pay for it. This is not a concern of suicidal mass murderers. The Citizens' Committee for the Right to Keep and Bear Arms reports that a video made by Boone County Indiana Sheriff Ken Campbell proves that a person with ten-round magazines can fire just as fast as with thirty round magazines. In the Virginia Tech massacre, the killer carried a number of 10-round magazines and does not seem to have been inconvenienced. Decades ago, I recall hearing of a misogynist killer at a Toronto school killing women with a Ruger Mini-14 using a 5-round magazine; he had the only gun in the building and so had things his own way. The anti-gun people cite a couple of instances in which a murderer fumbled a magazine change and was rushed by his targets. I will not have my safety rely on the criminal making a mistake. Prohibitionists wail that people who rush a murderer could not possibly shoot him; although, even in my youth I knew that it was easier to shoot a target than to rush it. In the Army, we had bayonets, but I cannot remember taking one out of the arms room, even for guard duty; none of us wanted to get to know the enemy that well. The prohibitionists wail that shooting mass murderers would cause bullets to "go everywhere" although it seems to me that the problem is always that bullets were going everywhere except at the bad guy. Confronting a mass murderer with a gun has worked every time. There is no reason to trust our lives to his mistake in changing magazines.

I continue to see arguments that cartridge limits on hunting shotguns justify limits on AR 15 magazines. The two purposes

are quite different. Birds do not shoot back, birds seldom attack and then not in packs. The limit on hunting shotguns was instituted to prevent market hunters from destroying entire populations of birds. Self-defense is not a sporting activity. The object is to take every advantage. One advantage is extra ammunition on board and ready whenever I snatch up my rifle.

The Department of Revenue and Highway Patrol have violated our privacy rights by distributing our personal information outside Missouri law enforcement. The law repeatedly prohibits such distribution. They first denied it, they lied to us. Now they admit it. The Highway Patrol said that they would do it again. A law enforcement agency violates the law and would do so again. After all, they are just violating the rights of gun nuts. Our local newspaper scolds us that we are paranoid little psychopaths. We are told that the information was only sent to Social Security to determine if one of us was fraudulently receiving benefits for mental health disability. We are told that the information was sent on encrypted disks that could not be read and were destroyed. Of course, this information comes from people who lied to us before. If Social Security is looking for fraud, it seems unlikely to find it in lists of CCW holders; our names went through the crazy computer when we got our licenses. The entire exercise was a lie from beginning to end and designed to violate our rights. They don't believe that we deserve rights; we are only gun nuts, we do not deserve rights. It is a little like the Cherokee removal from Georgia in 1830. They were one of the "civilized tribes." In The Outlaw Josie Wales, Chief Dan George said that meant they were easy to sneak up on. The Cherokee tried to accommodate the demands of their white neighbors but were told they did not need or deserve their rights, being only savages. They were stripped of their right to defend themselves in court, in their homes, and finally were driven on a death march to Oklahoma. If they plan to treat us the way they treated American Indians, we are in a great deal of trouble indeed.

The terror bomb in Boston was made from gunpowder, perhaps black powder. We can expect the re-enactors and reloaders to be punished. Nevermind that terrorists can make such low-level explosives in their kitchens.

A St. Louis CCW instructor has been accused of faking classes. This endangers the licenses of his 1,700 students and our CCW system. We need to keep an eye on cases like this. The opposition hates us and doubtless wants revenge for our recent success in congress and the legislature. They will use this case as an excuse.

I saw a T-Shirt which proclaims, "Good

guy with a gun." This could be a great shirt for open-carry advocates. I saw a video of an ex-Marine cop encountering an ex-Marine open-carry advocate (who appeared to be wearing a Marine T-shirt). Given this connection, things went much better than most such encounters.



A Johnson County KS judge has

MANY SECOND AMENDMENT RALLIES IN MISSOURI & ELSEWHERE

With the current awareness and events surrounding the mass shootings around the country, there has been a lot of rallies held by many different groups and some without "formal" sponsorship.

On January 16 in the Capitol Rotunda, there was the third annual "Consent of the Governed" which was held by a statewide conservative organization.

Although they addressed many issues relative to their cause, they also sought a speaker for the Second Amendment. They called on Marc Perez because many in this particular group knew of his interest in Second Amendment rights.

The response was very impressive from the mostly quiet crowd to the 6-minute talk. The event was posted on a few social media sites, and people who had never participated in any Second Amendment rallies or causes turned out in fairly large numbers. As Marc Perez was giving his talk, a group who remains unknown came up on the platorm with pro-2A signs and held them for all to see. These mysterious sign holders vanished after the talk, but word got around the capitol they went and talked with many legislators quite

spontaneously about our rights and the Second Amendment.

Ten days prior to January 19th, there was a call from the RKBA national organization for people around the country to meet at their state capitols and hold a "National Second Amendment Rally." A young man, Kenny Parks from Hannibal, MO (who had never been involved in any way with Second Amendment issues), heard of this and ran with the cause. On short notice, he obtained a permit for a rally on the north side (Missouri River side) of the Missouri Capitol known as the Veterans Memorial. Mostly with the help of social media, he struck out looking for people to talk, a PA system, and a crowd.

The crowd did show on short notice. National media was on site, and the event was an incredible success. The crowd was estimated by Capitol Police to be 800-1000 people. It overflowed the Veteran's Memorial area, and people gathered on the Capitol steps across the street. There were hundreds of pro-2A signs, flags and banners. One outstanding speaker was the host of a nationally syndicated conservative talk radio station from California Missouri. Beth Schoeneberg of www.csctalkradio.com. She was quite impressive and well versed on Second Amendment rights. She was also the emcee for the annual "Rally Day" on April 18, 2013 at 10 am in the 1st floor Rotunda at the Missouri State Capitol.

The annual Rally Day on April 18 was promoted at the rally on January 19th. There was a Facebook site promoting "Rally Day," and after January 19th, the attendance of Facebook to the Rally post grew by over 100 people in just over a week! Social media can be our friend indeed.



MSSA BYLAWS

AS AMENDED AND APPROVED JANUARY 12, 2013

ARTICLE I - Name

The name of this Pro Forma Decree Corporation is THE MISSOURI SPORT SHOOTING ASSOCIATION.

ARTICLE II - Location

County of Cole, State of Missouri.

ARTICLE III - Duration

The duration of the corporation shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE IV - Purpose

The purposes and objectives of the Missouri Sport Shooting Association

- A) To promote and defend the individual citizen's right to keep and bear arms for all legitimate purposes.
- B) To promote and further marksmanship training and competitions in the use of rifle, pistol, shotgun, and archery equipment to the end that such skill shall be of use and benefit in defense of person, property, state and nation, and in all shooting sports.
- C) It shall be the further purpose of this Association to promote and perpetuate the legal sport of hunting.

ARTICLE V - Power to Acquire Property

The corporation may acquire, in any legal manner, by purchase, gift, devise, bequest, or otherwise, any and all kinds of property which the Board of Directors may, by resolution, accept.

ARTICLE VI - Power to Borrow, Pledge and Convey

The corporation, through its Board of Directors, shall be empowered to borrow money, and to secure the payment of such indebtedness by the mortgage, pledge or hypothecation of any and all property of the corporation, unless such right as to particular property be denied in restrictions imposed by the donor of such property at the time of donation. The corporation may sell, lease, and convey any of the corporate property unless denied such right by the conveyance of such particular property to the corporation. Money or securities in the Treasurer's hands may be loaned or invested and reinvested in such manner, under such conditions, and on such items as the Board of Directors, without restrictions, may from time to time determine.

ARTICLE VII - Board of Directors

The affairs and property of the corporation shall be controlled and directed by a Board of eighteen (18) Directors who shall be elected at large and shall be members of this corporation. All employees of and contractors to the Association serve at the will of the Board of Directors.

- A) Manner of Election: The present members to serve until expiration of their present terms. Thereafter, as said terms expire (at their respective terms of one year, two years and three years) the general membership at each annual meeting shall vote by secret written ballot to elect by a majority vote six Directors to serve for three years.
- B) Vacancy: Any vacancy on the Board shall be filled by appointment by the President, subject to confirmation by a majority vote of the Board of Directors at their next meeting. Said appointee shall serve until the

- next annual meeting at which time the general membership shall vote to fill the balance of the unexpired term.
- C) Meetings: Board meetings shall be held quarterly at the place and time suitable to the Board members. Special Board meetings may be called by order of the President or the Vice President.
- D) Expulsion: Any Board member can be expelled for failure to perform his or her duties by a 2/3 vote of the Board. Said action may be taken at any regular or special meeting of the Board.
- The location of the corporation shall be in the City of Jefferson City, E) Appeal: Any member so expelled may appeal to the general membership at the next annual meeting and upon receiving a majority vote shall be reinstated.

ARTICLE VIII - Officers

Immediately following the annual election, the Directors shall elect from among themselves by secret ballot the following Officers each of whom shall serve for one year: President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary, and Executive Officer. Officers may appoint Assistants to perform certain duties of the Office as directed by the Officer. Officers are responsible to report such appointments to the Secretary for record.

A) Duties of President

- 1) The President shall preside at all Association, Board and general membership meetings;
- 2) Shall appoint all committees and shall be a member ex officio thereof;
- 3) Shall be authorized to sign checks in the absence of the Treasurer.

B) Duties of Vice President

1) The Vice President shall preside in the absence of the President or at his request at all meetings.

C) Duties of Treasurer

- 1) The Treasurer shall have charge of all Association funds and maintain current accounts receivable and accounts payable ledgers;
- 2) Shall also have custody of any certificates of deposit or savings accounts:
- 3) Upon approval and direction of the Board, shall invest surplus funds in certificates of deposit or interest-bearing accounts;
- 4) Shall furnish quarterly financial reports. The last quarterly report shall also be read at the annual meeting of the organization;
- 5) Shall prepare and submit an annual budget for Board approval at the first Directors meeting following the annual meeting;
- 6) Shall have charge of all financial records of the Association.

D) Duties of Secretary

- 1) The Secretary shall record the minutes of the quarterly board meeting and the annual members meeting of the Association.
- 2) Shall have charge of all non-financial official records of the Association, including the newsletter to the members.
- 3) Shall maintain all membership records of the Association and assist the Executive Officer as needed in the State Championship Match approval process.

- 4) Shall be authorized to sign checks in the absence of the Treasurer.
- E) Duties of the Executive Officer
 - The Executive Officer shall assist member Clubs in the promotion of State Championship Matches by furnishing awards approved by the Board of Directors and shall approve all programs for State Championship Matches.
 - Shall collect complete records of all Championship Matches, results and schedules. Said information shall be promptly conveyed to the Secretary for consideration of publication in The Missouri Shooter and for record.
 - Shall be responsible for the annual inventory of all Association equipment.

F) Bonding:

All Officers of the Board shall be subject to bonding in accordance with their position and probability of liability as determined by the Board annually.

ARTICLE IX - Membership

The following memberships are available to all American citizens of good repute in the following categories. The dues structure of each category shall be set annually by the Board of Directors.

- A) Individual Annual Membership
- B) Individual Annual Junior Membership (no voting privileges, special membership category for junior shooters). A person shall be considered a junior member through December 31 of the calendar year in which his or her 20th birthday occurs.
- C) Individual Life Membership
- D) Individual Benefactor Membership
- E) Affiliate Membership (Club or Organization)
- F) Military (One year free. Submit signed declaration of Missouri residency and active duty military service)
- G) Individual Honorary Life Membership (Granted by Board -- individual holds no voting privileges -- may be revoked by the Board.)

ARTICLE X - Amendments

The Board of Directors may adopt, repeal, or amend the Bylaws provided such actions are not inconsistent with the Articles of Incorporation as amended.

ARTICLE XI - State Championship Matches

- A) All State Championship Matches must be sponsored and conducted by Clubs which are affiliated with the Missouri Sport Shooting Association and any national body governing that particular shooting discipline.
- B) Said Matches will be in accordance with such additional regulations as may be deemed necessary by the Executive Committee.
- C) Procedure of requesting State Championship Matches:
 - Application to conduct and sponsor a Missouri Championship Match must be made in writing to the attention of the Executive Officer of the Missouri Sport Shooting Association. It must be accompanied by a preliminary program and proposed dates for

- approval by the Executive Officer. In the event the Executive Officer is unable to perform this duty, the approval may be made by the MSSA Secretary, Vice President or President.
- Dates and program must be subsequently approved by the national sanctioning body governing that shooting discipline.
- Changes in the program must be approved by both the Missouri Sport Shooting Association and the national sanctioning body governing the concerned discipline.
- A final match bulletin when published must be sent to the Executive Officer for the records of the Missouri Sport Shooting Association.
- All competitors receiving the title of "State Champion" must be a resident of the State of Missouri at the time the tournament is conducted.
- 6) All adult Missouri residents shooting in a State Championship Match must be a member of the State Association. All Junior shooters competing in a State Championship Match must be either a member of the State Association in their own right or a member of a Junior Club that is affiliated with the State Association.
- 7) The Match Sponsor shall submit the fees collected for Association new members and renewals, Association tournament fees, two copies of the results, including a roster of participants with addresses to the Executive Officer within 30 days of the completion of the tournament.

D) Awards:

- The Missouri Sport Shooting Association will provide suitable awards to organizations sponsoring Missouri Championship Matches.
- Type and number of awards to be provided by the Missouri Sport Shooting Association will be determined annually by the Board of Directors
- 3) There shall be a fee collected for the State Championship Matches as set by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE XII - Suspension or Expulsion of Members or Clubs

- A) Member Club. A Member Club shall be suspended upon non-payment of annual dues. It shall be expelled for causes detrimental to the Association, upon majority vote of the Board of Directors.
- B) Individuals. Individuals shall be suspended upon non-payment of annual dues. An individual shall be expelled for causes detrimental to the Association, upon majority vote of the Board of Directors.
- C) Reinstatement. Any Club or individual member may be reinstated after being suspended upon the payment of current and delinquent dues. Any Club or individual member that has been expelled may be reinstated by a majority vote of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE XIII - Rules of Order

All meetings and general order of business conducted by this Association shall lie in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order.

ARTICLE XIV - Dissolution

Dissolution shall be accomplished in accordance with the laws of the State of Missouri. All assets after the payment or disposition of all obligations shall be transferred or assigned to the National Rifle Association of America
